Dear Parents and Carers,

I am writing to inform you of a recent increase in anti-social behaviour and disorder within the Southall areas over the past few weeks.

We have received a number of reports from local businesses and residents expressing concern about the conduct of some school-aged children and young people. These incidents are causing disruption and concern within the community. In response, we have increased patrols in the area to address these issues; however, we would greatly appreciate your support in helping to prevent further occurrences.

We kindly ask that you take time to read and reinforce the following safety and preventative advice with your child:

- 📄 **Ensure you are aware of your child's whereabouts and expected time of return home**
- 📄 **Discuss the importance of using safe, direct routes when travelling, avoiding unnecessary detours or stops**
- 📄 **Discourage association with individuals involved in anti-social behaviour or disorder**
- 📄 **Encourage your child not to congregate in large groups**
- 📄 **Remind your child to remain vigilant, be aware of their surroundings, and avoid displaying valuable items such as mobile phones in public**
- 📄 **Report any incidents of anti-social behaviour or disorder to the police**

Please note that a Public Spaces Protection Order (PSPO) is in force across the London Borough of Ealing. Further information, including the full order and map, can be found here:
