Future Frontiers

Future Frontiers is a career coaching programme that matches young people with inspiring graduates and professionals. The selected professionals deliver weekly coaching sessions that guide pupils to discover and explore careers that will inspire them to achieve in school. 25 Year 10 students were selected to participate in this prestigious programme and they are working with International SOS, the world's leading medical & travel security services company. The students had an introductory assembly, four one to one two hour coaching sessions at Chiswick Business Park, as well as a video call with another professional from industry. They will then attend a careers conference in the summer term.



Brilliant Club

We launched The Brilliant Club in school with some high performing year 10 students intelligent applications. The response was excellent which showed a real interest in the year group to do well. Twenty four of the best replies were selected to participate in the programme, followed by a fantastic launch trip to the University of Cambridge. Twelve students are participating in a humanities programme, studying "From Columbus to Castro: Cuban Art History" and twelve are on a STEM programme studying "The Virtual Journey from Proteins to Cures: Computer Aided Drug Design". A PhD tutor comes into school for 5 university style tutorials and then they write a 2,000 word essay which gets marked just as it would at university.

Mathemagic Show

Year 8 maths scholars prepared for the 'Mathemagic Magic Show 2019' for our local Primary schools students. This maths enrichment activity was a great opportunity for our youngsters to lead a section of the show and to display their mathematical skills in order to inspire the audience.



Senior Maths Challenge

"The Senior Maths Challenge is a 90-minute exam with 25 multiple-choice questions of progressing difficulty. It challenges individuals in terms of their problem-solving abilities. Most candidates only answer about 15 questions, as there is a penalty for guessing answers. Whilst almost all the questions can be answered with GCSE Maths knowledge, the questions are usually focused on spotting a trick to simplify the problem. Most of the problems are on geometry and algebra, although there are questions on more obscure topics. People who take the SMC do so to improve their capacity to problem solve, encounter strange and abstract problems, but it is also a qualifier for the British Mathematical Olympiad. It is incredibly difficult to get into the Olympiad, and so many take the SMC in Year 12 as preparation so that they can get a high enough score in Year 13 to attempt to qualify. Apart from that, it's certainly been a very fun experience (it's not often that you are given 25 interesting problems for free!), and I hope to repeat it next year, hopefully getting a higher score!" - Jan Wrobel, Year 12.

Art of the Month

This editions incredible art of the month is awarded to Smita Sharma in year 9. The piece is her first assessment piece for art and is inspired by the work of Chuck Close a very famous American artist. Smita created this by using the grid method. This technique involves drawing and shading one square at a time to ensure an extremely accurate representation.
